Schools and faces of structural linguistics after Saussure. Linguistic typology. Typological regularity. Types of languages according to different parameters (phonetic, grammatical, morphological). Morphological typology of languages. Synthetic and analytic languages. Linguistics of universals. Formal syntax. Generativism and its basic concepts and positions. Semantic syntax. Grammar of constructions. Functional-communicative paradigm: linguistic pragmatics. Speech act and its structure. Types of speech acts. Hypothesis of linguistic relativity. Linguistic picture of the world. Language concepts. Cognitive linguistics: reasons for its emergence, founders, main cognitivists.
