Subject objectives	The aim of the course is to familiarise students with the mechanisms of cultural memory functioning and the theoretical and practical foundations of memory studies. Particular emphasis is placed on presenting the contemporary dimension of cultural memory in Russia (e.g. in the mass media, in mass culture), showing various cultural practices of memory and forgetting. In addition, the aim of the course is to provide students with tools for analysing the category of memory in literary studies.
