Currency market - basic concepts, features, functions, instruments, foreign currencies and foreign exchange, exchange rates (BID, OFFER, indirect and direct quotations), factors influencing the exchange rate, currency transactions, currency position, 4. Capital market - basic concepts, instruments (bonds, concepts related to bonds, settlement price, clean price), shares (types, shareholder rights, subscription rights, rights to shares), WSE, stock exchange quotations and orders, investment funds (investment certificates, participation units), depository receipts. 5. Derivatives market - spot and futures transactions, exchange-traded and over-the-counter derivatives, functions of derivatives, forwards, futures, options, swaps, simple option strategies.
