The aim of the course is to enable students to develop expertise in graphic art and drawing, primarily in the European context. The blocks devoted to paper techniques aim to present the basic techniques of graphic art and drawing from the Middle Ages to the present day. The course includes visits to the Drawing Room and Graphic Arts Studio of the MNGd and the Gdańsk City Gallery, allowing students to see works on paper firsthand.
