Subject objectives	As part of this elective, students can choose one of two thematic blocks. The aim of the course is to introduce students to issues related to the study of selected areas and genres of art: Eastern Church art, ceramics, glass, and numismatics. Students should learn to recognize different types of liturgical vestments and elements of Eastern Rite church furnishings. They should learn about their use and the related terminology. The course introduces students to the techniques and technology of ceramics and glass production, as well as the typology of these products. Numismatic heritage studies aim to familiarize students with the historical, aesthetic, and technical aspects of ancient coins. The above thematic blocks are intended to help future graduates of the program recognize these works on the art market and in museum or antique practice.

Subject contents	The knowledge imparted is intended for practical use in the art market, antique shops, and museums. The ability to recognize elements of Orthodox church furnishings is essential for skillfully assessing their use, date of origin, environment of origin, and material value. Various types of artistic crafts, icons, and devotional items used in Orthodox and Uniate churches will be presented. Their different variants will be discussed depending on the time of their creation and the region in which they originated. As part of the presentation, students will study selected monuments of Orthodox art influenced by Byzantine civilization.
