Subject objectives	Within the framework of this faculty, the student has a choice of one of the two thematic blocks included in it. The aim of this course is to introduce students to issues connected with antique art of selected areas and artistic genres: Eastern Church art, ceramics, glass and numismatics. Students should learn to recognise different types of liturgical paraments and elements of equipment in Eastern Rite temples. They should learn their use and related terminology. The class will familiarise the student with the technique and technology of ceramics and glass production, as well as the typology of these products. Numismatic antiquity aims to familiarise the student with the historical, aesthetic and technical aspects of ancient numismatic art. The above thematic blocks are intended to facilitate future recognition of these works on the art market and in museum or antiquarian practice.

Subject contents	The knowledge imparted is intended to serve in professional practice: in the art market, antique shops, museums. The ability to recognise elements of orthodox church furnishings is a prerequisite for skilful evaluation of their use, time of creation, environment of origin and material value. Different types of works of artistic craftsmanship, icons, devotional items that are on the equipment of Orthodox and Uniate churches will be presented. Their different variants will be discussed, depending on the time of their creation and the region in which they occurred. As part of the presentation, students will work on selected monuments of Orthodox art influenced by Byzantine civilisation.
