Students will explore the relationships between sport and national, EU, and international law, as well as issues related to disciplinary liability, sports arbitration, the financing of sport, and the protection of the rights of participants in the sports market. The course aims to develop students ability to analyze legal phenomena occurring in the field of sport and to understand the specificity and autonomy of sports law as a specialized regulatory branch.
