Failure to achieve the minimum score in either component will result in not passing the course. Class attendance is mandatory. Any unexcused absence exceeding 4 sessions (4 × 45 minutes) will result in failure to pass the course. An absence may only be excused with an official document, such as a medical certificate that includes a diagnostic code or an official letter from an institution. Other forms of justification will not be accepted.

Subject contents	The program content is introduced each time by means of several didactic methods. The choice of methods is up to the instructor. Topics implemented according to the schedule of the textbook are a pretext for learning: Constructing correct Chinese sentences and short statements on a given topic. Building dialogues related to the topics of the class and skillful use of lexical resources. To use the Chinese language freely in spontaneous everyday situations through an improvisation workshop. Dealing with language barriers and lexical gaps. Combine and apply knowledge gained from other language subjects.
