	familiarize themselves with the practical aspects of building, creating and drawing up financial statements, as well as familiarizing themselves with the principles of conducting economic analyses and drawing up financial reports and generating reports and analyses for the purposes of management accounting;		
	familiarize themselves with the practical aspects of using financial reporting and accounting documentation for the purposes of assessing the financial condition of economic entities, determining the structure of financing sources and their costs, valuing the value of selected components of the assets of economic entities, as well as preparing and analyzing ranking and rating assessments and implementing and assessing investment projects.
