The thematic scope includes both large enterprises and entities from the small and medium-sized enterprise (SME) sector. Students participating in the seminar will have the opportunity to write bachelors theses on topics related to financial analysis, the assessment of business performance, the use of controlling tools, and ESG reporting. The seminar enables the development of theses with both analytical and research-oriented approaches such as financial data analysis, international comparisons, or the evaluation of the effectiveness of financial management strategies in various types of organizations. Particular emphasis is placed on the practical aspects of enterprise functioning in a changing economic environment.
