Subject objectives	The objective of the course is to familiarize students with the fundamental concepts, institutions, and sources of sports law, as well as the organizational structure of sport in Poland and globally. Students will explore the relationships between sport and national, EU, and international law, as well as issues related to disciplinary liability, sports arbitration, the financing of sport, and the protection of the rights of participants in the sports market. The course aims to develop students ability to analyze legal phenomena occurring in the field of sport and to understand the specificity and autonomy of sports law as a specialized regulatory branch.

		Understands and is familiar with the legal and ethical principles applicable in the national and international system of sports organization, including the rules governing disciplinary liability, sports arbitration, and the relationship between the autonomy of sports organizations and public-law oversight. Is able to indicate examples of how these principles are applied in the activities of sports administration and sports organizations. Knows the basic legal regulations concerning the organization and functioning of the sports system, in particular in the areas of administrative, civil, and criminal law in the context of sport. Understands the practical application of these regulations by public administration bodies and sports organizations. Is familiar with the basic concepts and legal terminology relevant to sports law and is able to situate sports law within the system of legal and administrative sciences. Understands the significance of sports law for the functioning of society and the economy, especially in the context of sport as a social, economic, and political phenomenon. Understands the methods and tools appropriate for researching and analyzing sports law issues, including techniques for obtaining information from national and international legal sources as well as the case law of sports bodies and courts. Can apply these methods to analyze specific administrative and legal problems related to sport. Has an organized knowledge of the processes of change in organizational and institutional structures in sport, both at the national and international levels, and knows the consequences of these changes for the functioning of sports administration, participants in the sports market, and the disciplinary liability system. Understands the relationships between public administration structures and sports organizations, is familiar with the principles of supervision, cooperation, and division of competences in the field of sports governance, and can identify mechanisms through which public authorities influence the functioning of the sports system.
