Subject contents	Internships for IS UG students majoring in sociology can be held in the following institutions: social research laboratories; local government-administrative institutions such as commune offices, city offices, labor offices; Social welfare homes, orphanages, hospices; public benefit institutions, foundations, non-governmental organizations; cultural institutions like museums, community centers, libraries; communications media and news agencies; enterprises, especially those with developed marketing and human resource management activities; human resources. Students can carry out internships by participating in research conducted by individual researchers of the Institute of Sociology of UG. The purpose of internships carried out in the sociology major is: preparation of students for work in various institutions, getting to know the specifics of the work of these institutions; learning about the principles of functioning and organization of institutions, offices and other establishments to develop the ability to apply in practice the knowledge gained during studies; learning about the labor market; establishing professional contacts. The realization of the objectives is carried out through participation in the implementation of tasks in the designated positions (in particular, particular: editing of communications; participation in research: evaluation, marketing, consumer, civic opinion; consumer, civic, etc.; participation in work on human resources management; participation in organizational work on external goals of the institution)
