Prerequisites and co-requisites	A prerequisite for participation in this course is passing the examination in French Literature in the semester immediately preceding the course (a student wishing to take French Literature of the Nineteenth Century in semester 3 must obtain a passing grade in the examination in French Literature of the Eighteenth Century). In exceptional cases, the course tutor may waive this rule. A prerequisite for taking part in classes is knowledge of Polish at a level which allows the student to achieve the expected learning outcomes, as well as knowledge of French at a minimum B1 level and of French literature of the periods preceding the literary epoch discussed in a given semester.
