Subject contents	Principles of phonetics of Portuguese. Grammar: definite and indefinite article; plural of nouns and adjectives; present tense (Presente do Indicativo) - regular and irregular verbs of the I, II and III conjugation; comparison of ser, estar, ficar and haver; demonstrative and non-conjugative pronouns; possessive pronouns; ir + infinitive and estar + infinitive; prepositions of place, movement and time. Vocabulary material: names of nationalities, countries, professions; names of days of the week; numerals up to 100; basic vocabulary related to cooking; dialogues in a café and a restaurant; names of basic household utensils and habitual activities.		
Prerequisites and co-requisites	Absence from tests announced in advance by the teacher can only be excused by a medical exemption. The test must be written immediately after the end of the leave and the student's return to class (failure to write the test will result in a failing grade). A failed mid-semester test may be re-sit only once. Failure to pass mid-semester tests will result in a failing grade at the end of the semester. Failure to be unprepared twice in class, i.e. no homework and/or failure to check the vocabulary (in sources indicated by the teacher) in the assigned exercises/texts will result in a failing grade. This grade may be improved upon completion of an additional assignment assigned by the teacher and receiving a passing grade from it. The teacher may fail a student whose absenteeism exceeds 40%. In the case of two teachers - credit for the course is given after a passing grade is obtained from each teacher, and the final grade is the arithmetic mean.
