Example issues/ example questions/ tasks being completed	Empirical work. Each participant(s) (individually, in a dyad or in a tract) will conduct a field study of cultural animation in the local environment. The study will consist of contacting the selected animator(s), free/in-depth interview(s) and at least one participant observation of an animation activity implemented/initiated by this person. The contact with the animator(s) should also involve getting to know the place and the community where he/she works. The study should also have a participatory element - preferably, if possible, involving assistance with the observed initiative. It should be accompanied by an analysis of foundational data. The field study should provide answers to the following questions: o the person's history as an animator/ s; o the characteristics of the animator group/environment/organization of which he/she is a part; o characteristics of the local environment in which/for which he/she works; o description of the contact with the animator(s) and field research; o description of your role(s) as a researcher; o description of the animation activity(ies) in which you participated; whether and why what you researched can be called cultural animation; what do you find exceptionally valuable in the field and activity you learned about and why; what could be improved in the formula of animation activities and the observed activity; what do you come back with (as sociologists/sociologists, but not only...)? Reference to the content of the subject and references to the literature will also be evaluated.
