Selected methodological problems in social research, m.in. conducting research in the natural sciences versus in the social sciences. Quantitative, qualitative and mixed methods. Stages of the research process. 3. Sociological interview and its types. Interview and survey. 4. Types of questions: open, closed, semi-open (semi-closed). 5. Advantages and limitations of open and closed questions from the researcher's and respondent's point of view. 6. Structure of the questionnaire: beginning, main part (questions), conclusion. Types of questions in terms of their place in the questionnaire and their role in interviews and surveys. 7. The role of piloting. Selection and training of interviewers. 8. Credibility of respondents in the context of interviewing as a new social situation Ethics in research (relations with research participants, classified research, anonymity, privacy, confidentiality). An example of a research project: loneliness of the elderly and factors differentiating them.
