Transcription and initial reading of interviews. 4. Data coding: procedures, types, tools. Constructing sociological narratives: how to organize and present conclusions from qualitative research? 5. Examples of qualitative data analysis in sociology: discussion of projects conducted by other researchers. 6. Different types of data and different types of analysis working with interviews versus analyzing existing data. 7. Is it possible to create different reports on the same topic? 8. Summary of classes and evaluation of projects conducted: comparing research strategies, conclusions, and the final shape of proposed analyses.
