Subject contents	Panorama of the Enlightenment (chronological boundaries, internal periodization and nomenclature of the era and its socio-cultural background). Classicism, sentimentalism, rococo (exposition of the main literary trends of the era: the most important genres, works, ideas, themes, creators). The form of the lecture is in the form of an original program depending on the person presenting it, and different topics are covered in terms of detailed content.		
Prerequisites and co-requisites	The condition for participation in classes is to pass the first semester of classes in Old Polish literature. In exceptional cases, the person conducting the classes may waive from these requirements. The course participant should demonstrate knowledge of poetics and be able to independently create written works using various sources. In the case of foreign students, it is necessary to know the Polish language well enough to understand the content presented during classes and actively participate in them. The condition for admission to the exam is passing the exercises (details see: subject card: Enlightenment literature, exercises) and passing the lecture, which consists of: • completing the work (100%) in the form of a team-prepared portfolio on the topics covered during the lectures or passing a colloquium on the topics of the lectures (100%), or a written study of an issue selected by the lecturer (100%). This form is decided by the person conducting the lecture and informs about it at the beginning of the class cycle.

Example issues/ example questions/ tasks being completed	The lecture is an original class, depending on the lecturer. The issues discussed may each time have different content, in the context of selected literary works of the Enlightenment era. Examples of issues that may be discussed during the lecture: time frame of the Enlightenment formation, outline of social and civilizational changes in the era, the importance of education in the Enlightenment, more important cultural institutions, creative circles, theoretical and literary thought of the era, literary trends, selected profiles of creators of this period, culture-forming role women in the Enlightenment, theater culture, periodicals of the Enlightenment.
