Subject contents	The subject and tasks of syntax. Basic syntactic units. Types of word combinations based on: 1) structure; 2) constitutive member; 3) type of syntactic relation; agreement, government, and adjoinment. Types of simple sentences. Main parts of the sentence subject, predicate, and ways of their expression. Secondary parts of the sentence attribute, complement, adverbial, and ways of their expression. Types of one-member sentences. Additional sentence components: series, detached member, parenthesis, parenthetical utterance, address terms. Types of coordinate compound sentences. Types of subordinate compound sentences. Asyndetic compound sentences. Multiple compound sentences.		
Prerequisites and co-requisites	The condition for participation in the lecture is passing the exam in Grammar of the Modern Russian Language in the semester immediately preceding the subject. In exceptional cases, the person conducting the classes may depart from this rule. The condition for taking the exam is obtaining a credit for the exercises in Grammar of the Modern Russian Language in the fourth semester.
