Example issues/ example questions/ tasks being completed	Complete sentences/table with noun in proper form, adjective in proper degree, etc. Complement sentences with prepositions in the correct form (to a noun with a definite, indefinite or without a particle). Complete sentences with prepositions linked by a recitative adjective. Completing sentences with given words. Completing sentences with the antonym of a noun or adjective. Correctly forming feminatives, names of inhabitants from names of countries, compound nouns and compound adjectives. Correct formation of adverbs, their negation and their use in a sentence. Converting sentences - adverbs into adjectives and vice versa.
