Subject contents	The subject provides for the continuous and integrated teaching of all language skills: receptive: listening and reading comprehension, productive: writing and speaking, vocabulary expansion, correct phonetic articulation. In each higher semester of study, listening texts and reading texts contain richer subject matter and a higher degree of differentiation of lexical-grammatical structures. Leading themes: Charity (involvement in social projects, philanthropy); Architecture (architectural styles, the future of architecture, architecture and climate change); Stereotypes: typically German - or which ones?; Travel and places (travel yesterday and today, travel destinations, historical places and events).The course tutor selects the specific content of the subject area and determines which topics students pursue independently.
