Subject objectives	The aim of the course is to introduce students to the principles governing the organisation and safety management of sporting events under national law and the regulations issued by national and international sports organisations. The course seeks to develop the ability to identify key duties and liabilities of event organisers, analyse the formal procedures required for preparing sporting events, and understand the relationship between state law and sports regulations in areas such as participant safety, access control, cooperation with public authorities, and the responsibilities of security and organisational services.

Formal requirements for organising a sports event (applications, documentation, regulations, contracts). 5. Procedures for obtaining permits to organise a sports event and the basic principles of cooperation with public administration bodies and security services. 6. Obligations of the organiser towards participants of a sports event, security services and public administration. 7. Legal status of participants in a sports event (spectators, athletes, staff) and their basic rights and obligations. 8. Safety measures used during sports events: access control, monitoring, identification of participants, security measures. 9. Basic rules of criminal, misdemeanour and administrative liability for violations of regulations on the organisation and safety of sports events.
