<b>Subject objectives</b>	<p>The course introduces students to the complex structure of Polish sports law, beginning with an in-depth analysis of the current Act on Sport of 2010 and its subsequent amendments, while also presenting comparable legislative solutions adopted in other countries and linking them to the content of supranational and non-state sports regulations. A key component of the course is demonstrating the importance of interpreting (applying) the provisions of the Act on Sport in the context of implementing sports law across different levels of jurisdiction. The programme further includes an examination of the aims and functions of anti-doping legislation through the lens of the Polish Act on Combating Doping in Sport of 2017, as well as a discussion of the legal framework governing the safety of sporting events under the Polish Act on the Safety of Mass Events and similar regulations enacted in other jurisdictions.</p>
