Subject contents	The concept of postmodernism - definitions, time frames, variations. Changing the cultural paradigm in the second half of the 20th century. The specificity of postmodernism in the former Yugoslavia and post-Yugoslav countries. Features of postmodern literature: semiosis and fiction (instead of mimesis), non-linearity, metafictionality (metatextuality), intertextuality (intercultural), failure to distinguish genres and expanding the boundaries of literature (non-literary genres, paraliterature), arnosubjectivity, multi-tasking. Dialogue with tradition. Problematization of language as the subject of a poem. A generation of fantasists.
