Language and Skills</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Listening: can understand phrases and expressions articulated slowly and clearly, related to important areas (daily life, work, home, leisure, family, travel, food, etc.); can generally identify the topic of a discussion conducted slowly and clearly; can pick out the main content of simple messages and announcements; can extract information from short recordings on everyday topics. • Reading: understands short, simple texts on familiar topics written in simple language; understands standard private and business correspondence; can locate specific information in lists/directories and select necessary data (e.g., find information in a book). • Interaction: can participate in short conversations with relative ease with help from the conversation partner; handles simple, routine exchanges in everyday situations; can ask and answer basic questions; can establish social contacts, use daily polite forms, respond to invitations, proposals, and apologies; can express likes and dislikes. • Production: can present simple descriptions, tell a story listing events and facts; can describe plans and arrangements; can describe family, education, work; can give a short, rehearsed speech on a familiar topic explaining own opinions. • Writing: can write texts consisting of simple phrases; can write about daily matters in their own surroundings; create very short descriptions of events and personal experiences. <p>II.
