Subject contents	<p>I. Language and Skills</p> <p>Listening: can understand phrases and expressions articulated slowly and clearly, related to important areas (daily life, work, home, leisure, family, travel, food, etc.); can generally identify the topic of a discussion conducted slowly and clearly; can pick out the main content of simple messages and announcements; can extract information from short recordings on everyday topics.</p> <p>Reading: understands short, simple texts on familiar topics written in simple language; understands standard private and business correspondence; can locate specific information in lists/directories and select necessary data (e.g., find information in a book).</p> <p>Interaction: can participate in short conversations with relative ease with help from the conversation partner; handles simple, routine exchanges in everyday situations; can ask and answer basic questions; can establish social contacts, use daily polite forms, respond to invitations, proposals, and apologies; can express likes and dislikes.</p> <p>Production: can present simple descriptions, tell a story listing events and facts; can describe plans and arrangements; can describe family, education, work; can give a short, rehearsed speech on a familiar topic explaining own opinions.</p> <p>Writing: can write texts consisting of simple phrases; can write about daily matters in their own surroundings; create very short descriptions of events and personal experiences.</p> <p>II. Grammar</p> <p>definite and indefinite articles, formation of plural nouns and adjectives, formation of present tense for regular and irregular verbs, modal verbs, prepositions, combined pronouns, formation and use of simple past and simple future tenses, possessive adjectives and pronouns, direct object pronouns.</p> <p>Students deepen their knowledge by solving problems and tasks outside of class and consulting with the lecturer.</p>
