<b>Subject objectives</b>	<p>Within the framework of this faculty, the student has a choice of one of two thematic blocks. The block devoted to goldsmithing will introduce the students to the basic techniques used in this field, the properties of metal materials, types of objects made, and the process of creating works of art using selected examples from different periods. The block devoted to craft objects made of amber will introduce the students to works such as altars, sculptures, vessels and other artifacts made of amber as an artistic material characteristic of the area around the Gulf of Gdansk. The conservation and storage of these delicate monuments will also be addressed. Practical classes will include visits to, among others, the Amber Museum and amber studios providing practical skills.</p>
