Formulate relevant problems in economics, consistent with the specialisation studied, which could be the subject of research in the master's thesis.</li> <li>2. Formulate the aim and hypotheses, thesis or research questions of the master's thesis.</li> <li>3. Selection and analysis of appropriate sources of knowledge relevant to the explanation of the problem in question, while respecting the principles of intellectual property protection.</li> <li>4. Preparation of an original description and diagnosis of the subject of the study as a basis for the realisation of the aim of the thesis.</li> <li>5. Development of a concept for a detailed analysis of all research aspects.</li> <li>6. Preparation of development scenarios, forecasts or strategies concerning the researched problem.</li> <li>7. Correct editing of the thesis text (communicativeness, scientific language of the study, bibliographic description, error control).</li> <li>8. Preparation of bibliography, list of tables and figures according to the departmental template and instructions.</li> <li>9. Preparation of a summary of the thesis in Polish and English.</li> </ol> <p>The students masters seminar will include 35 hours of consultations with the supervisor, during which issues related to the research area and the structure of the thesis, methodology and formulation of conclusions will be discussed.</p>
