Subject contents	Introduction to transport law: Concept, functions, and sources of transport law (national, EU, and international), public and private law aspects of transport activities. Public administration in transport: Competencies of government and local government administration bodies in regulating the transport market, the institution of licenses, permits, and concessions. Civil law aspects and contracts in transport: Legal construction of the transport contract in domestic transport (Transport Law Act) and international transport (CMR Convention), forwarding contract, charter contract, rules of civil liability of the carrier, and the significance of Incoterms commercial rules in the supply chain Transport insurance: Types of transport insurance, including carrier's liability insurance (OCP) and cargo insurance. Road transport law: Rules for performing road transport and own-account transport, regulations regarding drivers' working time, and competencies of the Road Transport Inspection (ITD). Railway transport law: Railway infrastructure management, access to infrastructure, licenses, and tasks of the Office of Rail Transport (UTK). Aviation transport: Legal basis for the functioning of civil aviation, national and international aviation law, and the role of the Civil Aviation Authority (ULC). Maritime and inland waterway transport: Legal basis of maritime economy and inland navigation, administrative-legal aspects of navigation, and the role of Maritime Offices.
